## INFORMATION ON VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

The following information is provided in the hope of making the contributions and charges structure clear for parents. We wish to assure parents that our efforts have been directed towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible and in accordance with the Education Act Regulations.

The 2017 Charges and Voluntary Contributions statements for each year level provide details on how the voluntary contribution amounts are allocated to learning areas from Year 7 to Year 10, as well as the compulsory charge for elective courses. The Year 11 and 12 course is considered post compulsory as students can choose to attend SWIT, obtain employment or an apprenticeship, and therefore all charges are compulsory under the Education Act Regulations.

Information on maximum possible costs for other optional activities such as excursions and camps that students may choose to participate in has also been provided.

### CONTRIBUTIONS & CHARGES

There are three components to the financial requests.

#### 1. Voluntary Contributions

The College is requesting a voluntary contribution of **\$235 for each Year 7-10** student towards the cost of materials, resources and facilities used by students in the educational program. These contributions will make a significant contribution to the quality of educational programs that can be delivered.

#### 2. Compulsory Charges

- (a) **Year 9 and 10 elective courses** which students have selected may attract a compulsory charge. **Year 11 and 12 courses** are considered post-compulsory and therefore all charges are considered **compulsory** under the Education Act Regulations. There is no maximum charge for these charges however the school will keep costs to a minimum.
- (b) **Extra Cost optional activities** which address broad learning outcomes and for which there is an extra cost – e.g. excursions, camps, carnivals, social events etc. A maximum cost for these has been listed, and parents are required to pay only if students take part. These costs will be collected throughout the year as the activities arise.
- (c) **Off Campus Courses – Senior School**  
Year 11 and 12 students enrolling in off-campus courses at South West Institute of Technology (SWIT) or Bunbury Regional Trade Training Centre (BRTTC) will be invoiced directly by the relevant training institution. These charges must be paid directly to the relevant provider. BRTTC will charge a maintenance fee of \$320 which may be collected by the school on behalf of BRTTC.  
Depending on the chosen industry, students may also be required to purchase a uniform, protective equipment, text books and trade equipment/tools. Successful applicants will be advised of the costs associated with each program, with their letters of offer before they commence tuition.

#### 3. Other Costs

- (a) **Personal Items** which the students require to participate in an elective course such as safety glasses, stationery, calculators, etc., which can be purchased from any supplier.
- (b) **General Optional Items** which students may choose to use or purchase but are not considered essential to the educational program.

## VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

The following voluntary donations also appear on student Contributions and Charges Sheets:

**P & C Fundraising Donation** - P & C Fundraising Donation for 2017 has been set at **\$20.00 per family**. If you would like input into where fundraising monies are spent, please consider becoming a member and attend meetings held twice a term. Membership of the P & C Association is **\$1.00 per person** and payable at the Annual General Meeting in 2016 or via the school.

- **School Chaplain – \$20.00 per family**. The role of the chaplain is to provide for the pastoral care needs of all students. School chaplains counsel students and are able to provide families with support on a range of issues or to advise them of other sources of support in the community.

Whilst funded in part by the National School Chaplaincy Programme as a Christian presence within the school, it is not the role of the chaplain to teach or espouse religious beliefs to students. Rather, the chaplain plays an integral part of the Student Services Team within a school to help and support students who may be having difficulties with a wide range of issues such as bullying, anxiety, depression, friendship and relationship issues.

## REFUND POLICY

The refund or transfer of charges and voluntary contributions will be completed in accordance with the Department's "Refund of Charges and Voluntary Contributions in Secondary Schools" documentation.

The School Board has endorsed a "No Refund" policy for payments, including deposits for camps, excursions and other optional activities, where costs are not recoverable by the school. In the event that a refund is approved, payment will be made via EFT. Refunds less than \$30 will be credited to the student's account and used to offset other costs as directed by parents.

Parents/carers will be issued with a 2017 Charges & Contributions statement in Term 4 2016 advising voluntary contributions and charges for each student.

## Student Requirements

Stationery items **will not** be available for purchase at the college. These items can be purchased as per the Student Requirement List from OfficeMax or at any store of your choice.

Parents will not be required to buy text books for students in Years 7 - 10. Voluntary contributions enable the college to purchase class sets which students may borrow. If students lose textbooks or library books they will be expected to pay for a replacement book to be purchased.

## Text Books Year 11 & 12

**Please note:** Text books form part of the compulsory charges for Year 11 and 12 subjects. These books can be purchased from OfficeMax or a supplier of your choice. Please see the relevant Student Requirements List for further details. Some subjects may not have text books listed. In these cases the text book or text book hire fee may be included in the subject charge.

## Bring Your Own Device Program (BYOD)

Dalyellup College and the wider community recognise the beneficial features of technology within an education environment and the ever increasing role that technology plays. Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) is a popular and affordable process for students and parents/caregivers, whereby students can bring their own technology from home to access the schools' internet connection. Whilst Dalyellup College already provides a large array of technological services and education to students, the ICT committee recognises the need for such a program for students, as it is a practical and cohesive idea.

BYOD is strongly encouraged for all Year 11 and Year 12 ATAR students. Students who do not have their own device will have access to a school owned device during school hours. ## Safety Glasses

It is a safety requirement of the school that students must have a pair of approved safety glasses for all Design & Technology classes. All Year 7 and 8 students will participate in these classes throughout the year and will require safety glasses.

Year 9 to 12 students will require glasses only if participating in these classes as an elective course. Please refer to the Student Requirements lists.

## Calculators

- All students in Years 7 – 10 and Mathematics: General senior school will require a scientific calculator. The calculator recommended by the school is a **CASIO fx-82 AU Plus Scientific calculator**.
- Students studying Mathematics Applications or Mathematics Methods in senior school will require a **Casio Classpad CP400 Graphics Calculator**. Please refer to the relevant Student Requirements list.



Students require a student ID Library Card. The ID card, similar to that displayed, will have several functions.

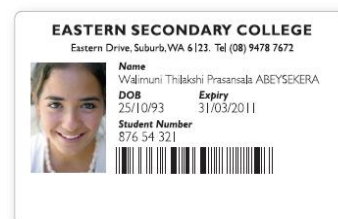
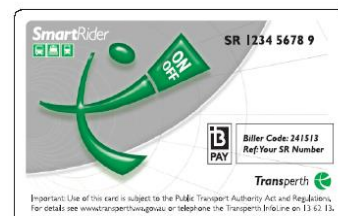
The card will allow students to borrow school text books and resources from the Library. Replacement ID cards are available from the Library at a cost of \$3.00.

The reverse side of the card will be the SmartRider card which enables students to access concession travel on Transperth bus, rail and ferry services, and TRANSWA country road and rail services.

Cinemas will also accept the card as proof of student status.

Note: The card production is outsourced, and the company will need to access information about your child from the school database. This includes name, address and date of birth.

## Dalyellup College - Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Information and Outline

### What is BYOD?

Dalyellup College and the wider community recognise the beneficial features of technology within an education environment and the ever increasing role that technology plays. Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) is a popular and affordable process for students and parents/caregivers, whereby students can bring their own technology from home to access the schools' Internet connection. Whilst Dalyellup College already provides a large array of technological services and education to students, the ICT committee recognises the need for such a program for students, as it is a practical and cohesive idea.

### Dalyellup College Responsibilities

- Dalyellup College will play an active role in the BYOD program at the school, and as such will agree to ensure that the schools Wi-Fi access is reliable and readily accessible. Moreover the school will ensure that student's internet access is monitored and filtered for misuse, and more importantly complies with both the School's Network Usage Agreement and the Department of Education's.

### Student and Parent / Carer Responsibilities

- Students to be reminded that BYOD is an amendment/appendix of the network usage agreement at Dalyellup College and that the Network Usage Agreement must be **strictly** followed at all times.
- Ensure the BYOD device is a supported device and meets the minimum Dalyellup College BYOD standards of requirements.
- Ensure the device is properly looked after and stored securely.
- Ensure the device's system is current and up to date (all current updates installed, and patched correctly)
- Ensure the device has some form of anti-virus software installed.
- It is the student's responsibility to maintain a backup of all-important data used on their device.
- Students to ensure that the device has the appropriate student office software installed, including Microsoft Office or equivalent (Pages, Keynote, Numbers, Open Office etc.). At no times will the school provide any licensed Department of Education software.
- Students must ensure the device is fully charged prior to the commencement of school each day.
- Students must sign the amended Dalyellup College Network Usage Agreement which outlines the terms and conditions for BYOD.
- Students must be aware that devices are to be used only under strict guidance from the teachers and should only be switched on when asked to do so. Moreover, devices are not to be used inappropriately during break times or in breach of the school rules.
- Students must understand that they are solely responsible for the device and that lost, stolen or damaged devices are not the responsibility of the school.
- Students to ensure that the only connection used on campus is the Dalyellup College Wireless or Wi-Fi network and that no cellular (Mobile Data) or 'tethering' connections are to occur.

### Misuse of Devices

- If the student's device has been misused or any of the BYOD protocols have been broken the device may be confiscated and handed into to Student Services for the student to collect after school.
- Further breaches will result in a consultation with staff which could lead to revoking of network privileges.

## 2017 SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school.
- \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school and in the first instance will be applied towards voluntary contributions for students in Years 7 to 10. For students in Years 11 and 12 the allowance will be applied to cover compulsory charges in the first instance.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age i.e. students born in 1998 or before are ineligible in 2017.

The parent/guardian concession card number must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. Living Away from Home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

### Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Health Care Card
- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

**PLEASE NOTE:** The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued each year and expires in December of each year. This card is income means tested.

## ABSTUDY SUPPLEMENT ALLOWANCE

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Department of Human Services (Centrelink) card holders, this funding supplements the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment.

To be eligible for the supplement allowance, the parent/guardian must hold a Department of Human Services (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

Furthermore, the school or parent must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$78 or \$156 from the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance.

The Department of Education ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance consists of **\$79 paid directly to the school.**

**Please note that the Secondary Assistance Scheme cannot be claimed as well as this allowance.**

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student(s) enrolled in Years 7–12, studying a full time secondary course at a Western Australian public or private school.

Applications submitted for students from interstate for the Abstudy Supplement Allowance must be made within one month of the student enrolling at the school.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Health Care Card
- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card
- Veteran's Affairs pensioner Concession Card

The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds a health care card in their name and is declared independent by the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age. i.e. students born in 1998 or before are ineligible in 2017.
