Course Selection Sheet – Year 11 2017

At Dalyellup College we aim for all our senior school students to attain Secondary Graduation. This will demonstrate that the student has been successful in the program of study that they have chosen. Prospective employers will favourably consider those who have successfully graduated.

All students who achieve Secondary Graduation will be eligible for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE). To achieve WACE, students will need to either be eligible for a university admission rank (ATAR) or achieve a training Certificate II or higher. They will also need to demonstrate a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy.

All students in Western Australia must attend school or participate in an approved alternative option up to the end of the year in which they turn 17 years and six months.

At Dalyellup College we are able to offer a broad range of courses that cater for different academic abilities. In 2017, Year 11 students will choose one of four pathways and will make their subject selections from within that pathway.

Listed below is some information and guidelines to consider when making your pathway selection.

ATAR Pathway: For students preparing for university entry post Year 12.

- These courses have a **compulsory** external exam at the end of Year 12 and students studying these courses will receive an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) that is recognised by all Australian Universities.
- In order to gain direct entry to University and attain an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR), students must select **at least** four, Units 3 and 4 ATAR courses in Year 12.

NB: Dalyellup College encourages students in this pathway to also study a school based VET certificate to keep career options open. However please note: any Workplace Learning requirements associated with a VET Certificate in this pathway must be completed in the student's own time and not during school time.

School Based General Pathway: For students preparing for further training or employment post Year 12.

- These are Unit 1 and 2 General courses in Year 11 and Units 3 and 4 General courses in Year 12.
- Students may complete up to two Vocational Education and Training (VET) Certificate courses at Dalyellup College throughout the week in this pathway.
- By taking these courses students are leaving their post Year 12 options open to pursue employment, TAFE and further study.

Vocational Link Pathway: For students who complete Nationally Recognised Training in Years 11 and 12.

- Students may complete Vocational Certificates at South Regional TAFE or Trade Training Centre Vocational Certificates in this pathway.
- These courses are practical in nature and involve nationally recognised training in the specific industry area delivered by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) or State Training Provider (STP)
- These courses can lead to apprenticeships, employment or further VET study post Year 12.
- Students are generally in school 3 days each week and 1 or 2 days at South Regional TAFE or Trade Training Centre and/ or on workplace learning.

Senior School Engagement Program Pathway: For students with special needs or who need an alternative school program.

- This 3 day a week program is via invitation only and is tailored to student individual needs and may involve activities conducted in and outside the school.

Course Selection Sheet – Year 11 2017

Year 10 students wishing to select an ATAR pathway in senior school must meet certain academic requirements. The grades a student achieves in Year 9 and 10 are known to be the best predictor of how well they will succeed in Year 11.

Students wishing to select an ATAR pathway are required to achieve the following:

- The achievement of a minimum 2 “B” grades from either, Mathematics, English, Science or Humanities and Social Sciences in their Year 10 Semester One, 2016 report.
- Achievement of a Band 7 average or higher in Year 9 NAPLAN literacy and numeracy testing.
- Achievement of the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA) standard by the end of Year 10.

Subject/Course selection instructions

Although the school makes every effort to accommodate each student's course choices: insufficient number of students choosing a course may result in students having to re-select a course. Students will be informed should this eventuate. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that their selections qualify them for any future course or desired career and that these subjects are within their ability.

Students are asked to follow the instructions below when making their course selections:

1. Choose SIX courses or certificates as described in the *Senior School Course Handbook 2017*

Students identify the pathway they wish to pursue and then select six courses or certificates within that pathway.

2. Choose TWO Reserve Courses

If selecting the ATAR pathway, choose two extra courses to act as ‘reserves’. Reserve choices will be selected in order of preference should any of your first six choices become unavailable.

If selecting from the School Based General pathway or the Vocational Link pathway, choose a reserve course on each gridline.

3. Learning Area Approval

Each head of learning area or subject teacher will make recommendations for ATAR courses on offer.

Please note: Approval is on the basis of past performance and current achievement. This selection is either:

- **Approved:** the student is considered able to cope with this course, or
- **Not Approved:** This course is considered inappropriate for this student and they are advised to reconsider their selection. A Not Recommended Course Selection form is required and **MUST** be completed. This form can be found on page 8 of this course selection handbook.

ATAR PATHWAY: INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION:

Students selecting this pathway are preparing for university entry. **Students must select a minimum of four (4) ATAR Courses in Year 11.**

Students must select SIX subjects overall, as outlined in the Senior School Course Handbook 2016.

N.B. * indicates the course will have an exam. Please follow the instructions below:

1. Students must select English in Year 11.
2. Choose your 5 remaining selections from the subjects below. Place a tick (✓) in the box adjacent to the course you prefer.
3. Choose TWO extra courses to act as “reserves” in the space provided.
