VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND COMPULSORY CHARGES

The following information is provided in the hope of making the contributions and charges structure clear for parents. We wish to assure parents that our efforts have been directed towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible and in accordance with the Education Act Regulations.

The 2019 Charges and Voluntary Contributions statements for each year level provide details on how the voluntary contribution amounts are allocated to learning areas from Year 7 to Year 10, as well as the compulsory charge for elective courses. The Year 11 and 12 course is considered post compulsory as students can choose to attend SWIT, obtain employment or an apprenticeship, and therefore all charges are compulsory under the Education Act Regulations.

Information on maximum possible costs for other optional activities such as excursions and camps that students may choose to participate in has also been provided.

CONTRIBUTIONS & CHARGES

There are three components to the financial requests.

1. Voluntary Contributions

The College is requesting a voluntary contribution of **\$235 for each Year 7 to 10** student towards the cost of materials, resources, photocopying costs, text books and facilities used by students in their educational program. These contributions will make a significant contribution to the quality of educational programs that can be delivered.

2. Compulsory Charges

- (a) **Year 9 and 10 elective courses** may attract a compulsory charge. **Year 11 and 12 course charges** are considered **compulsory** under the Education Act Regulations. There is no maximum charge for these courses, however the school will keep costs to a minimum.
- (b) **Extra Cost Optional Activities** which address broad learning outcomes and for which there is an extra compulsory cost – e.g. excursions, camps, carnivals, social events etc. Maximum possible costs for these is listed at the back of this handbook. Parents are required to pay only if students choose to participate in these activities. These charges will be requested throughout the year as the activities arise. Please refer to pages 14 to 16.
- (c) **External Courses – Senior School**
 - Charges relating to the **FlexiTrack High** course through Murdoch University or **external online Certificate courses** offered by various Registered Training Organisations (RTO's) will be invoiced by, and payable directly to Dalyellup College. **A 50% deposit of the compulsory course charges must be paid at the time of enrolment, with the balance due prior to commencement of the course.** Failure to pay the 50% deposit by the due date will mean students will not be able to participate in the course.
 - Charges relating to external Certificate courses through **Bunbury Regional Trade Training Centre (BRTTC)** will be invoiced by, and payable directly to Dalyellup College. **A 50% deposit of the compulsory course charges must be paid prior to commencement of the course, with the remaining balance due by Friday 29 March 2019.** Failure to pay the 50% deposit by the due date will mean students may not be able to participate in the course.
 - Depending on the chosen industry, students may also be required to purchase a uniform, protective equipment, text books and trade equipment/tools. Successful applicants will be advised of the costs associated with each program, together with their letters of offer prior to the commencement of tuition.

3. Other Costs

- (a) **Personal Items** which the students require to participate in an elective course such as safety glasses, stationery, calculators, etc., which can be purchased from any supplier.
- (b) **General Optional Items** which students may choose to use or purchase but are not considered essential to the educational program.

VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

The following voluntary donations will appear on student Contributions and Charges statements:

- **P & C Fundraising Donation - \$20.00 per family.** If you would like input into where fundraising monies are spent, please consider becoming a member and attend meetings held twice per term.
- **School Chaplaincy Program – \$20.00 per family.** The role of the chaplain is to provide for the pastoral care needs of all students. School chaplains counsel students and are able to provide families with support on a range of issues or to advise them of other sources of support in the community.

Whilst funded in part by the National School Chaplaincy Programme as a Christian presence within the school, it is not the role of the chaplain to teach or espouse religious beliefs to students. Rather, the chaplain plays an integral part of the Student Services Team within a school to help and support students who may be having difficulties with a wide range of issues such as bullying, anxiety, depression, friendship and relationship issues.

REFUND POLICY

The refund or transfer of charges and voluntary contributions will be completed in accordance with the Department's "Refund of Charges and Voluntary Contributions in Secondary Schools" documentation.

The School Board has endorsed a "No Refund" policy for payments, including deposits for camps, excursions and other optional activities, where costs are not recoverable by the school. In the event that a refund is approved, payment will be made via EFT. Refunds less than \$30 will be credited to the student's account and used to offset other costs as directed by parents.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Parents/carers will be issued with a 2019 Charges & Contributions statement in Term 4 2018 advising voluntary contributions and charges payable for each student.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Stationery items **will not** be available for purchase at the college. These items can be purchased as per the Student Requirement List from Ziggies Educational Supplies or from any supplier of your choice.

Parents will not be required to buy text books for students in Years 7 to 10. Voluntary contributions enable the college to purchase class sets which students may borrow. If students lose textbooks or library books they will be expected to pay for the purchase of a replacement book.

TEXT BOOKS YEAR 11 & 12

Text books form part of the compulsory charges for Year 11 and 12 subjects. These books can be purchased from Ziggies Educational Supplies or a supplier of your choice. Please see the relevant Student Requirements List available from the school website at <http://www.dalyellupcollege.wa.edu.au/> for further details. Some subjects may not have text books listed. In this case the text book or text book hire fee may be included in the subject charge.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE PROGRAM (BYOD)

Dalyellup College and the wider community recognise the beneficial features of technology within an education environment and the ever increasing role that technology plays. Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) is a popular and affordable process for students and parents/caregivers, whereby students can bring their own technology from home to access the schools' internet connection. Whilst Dalyellup College already provides a large array of technological services and education to students, the ICT committee recognises the need for such a program for students, as it is a practical and cohesive idea.

BYOD is strongly encouraged for all Year 11 and Year 12 ATAR students. Students who do not have their own device will have access to a school owned device during school hours. For further information regarding system requirements and the type of devices that can be used as BYOD, please refer to the Dalyellup College BYOD Policy.

SAFETY GLASSES

It is a safety requirement of the school that students must have a pair of approved safety glasses for all Design & Technology classes. All Year 7 and 8 students will participate in these classes throughout the year and will require safety glasses. Year 9 to 12 students will require glasses only if participating in these classes as an elective course. Please refer to the Student Requirements lists. For those who choose not to purchase their own, the school provides a class set.

CALCULATORS All students require a scientific calculator to fully meet the requirements of the mathematics curriculum and. The calculator recommended by the school is a **CASIO fx-82 AU Plus Scientific calculator**. Students studying Mathematics Applications or Mathematics Methods in senior school will require a **Casio Classpad CP400 Graphics Calculator**. Please refer to the relevant Student Requirements list.



Students require a student ID Library Card. The ID card, similar to that displayed, will have several functions.

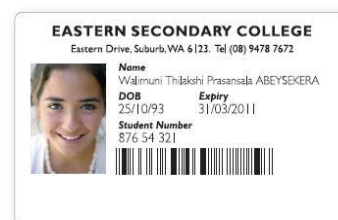
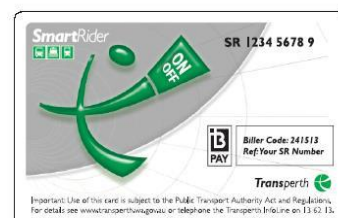
The card will allow students to borrow school text books and resources from the Library. Replacement ID cards are available from the Library at a cost of \$3.00.

The reverse side of the card will be the SmartRider card which enables students to access concession travel on Transperth bus, rail and ferry services, and TRANSWA country road and rail services.

Cinemas will also accept the card as proof of student status.

Note: The card production is outsourced, and the company will need to access information about your child from the school database. This includes name, address and date of birth.

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

The allowance consists of two components:

- **\$115 Clothing Allowance** paid directly to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian bank account. It can take between 8 to 12 weeks to receive this payment.
- **\$235 Educational Program Allowance** paid directly to the school. For students in Years 7 to 10 the allowance will be applied, in the first instance, towards the voluntary contribution. For students in Years 11 and 12 the allowance will be applied to cover charges in the first instance.

The parent/guardian concession card number must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. Students must be listed on claimant's card (except for some year 11 and 12 students, or in cases of disability/health reasons). In this instance, the school must sight both concession cards. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. Living Away from Home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age i.e. students born in 2000 or before are ineligible in 2019.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Health Care Card
- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

PLEASE NOTE: The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued each year and expires in December of each year. This card is income means tested.

Late Applications

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation.

Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.

ABSTUDY SUPPLEMENT ALLOWANCE

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Department of Human Services (Centrelink) card holders, this funding supplements the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment.

To be eligible for the supplement allowance, the parent/guardian must hold a Department of Human Services (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

Furthermore, the school or parent must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$78 or \$156 from the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance.

The Department of Education ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance consists of **\$79 paid directly to the school.**

Please note that the Secondary Assistance Scheme cannot be claimed as well as this allowance.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student(s) enrolled in Years 7 to 12, studying a full time secondary course at a Western Australian public or private school.

Applications submitted for students from interstate for the Abstudy Supplement Allowance must be made within one month of the student enrolling at the school.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Health Care Card
- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card
- Veteran's Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds a health care card in their name and is declared independent by the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age. ie. students born in 2000 or before are ineligible in 2019.

Late Applications

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation.

Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.
