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# 2024 Year 11 Subject Selection



## Year 11 Senior School Application

At Dalyellup College, we aim for all of our students to attain secondary graduation. All students who achieve secondary graduation will be eligible for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE). This will demonstrate that the student has been successful in the program of study that they have chosen. All students in Western Australia must attend school or participate in an approved alternative option up to the end of the year in which they turn 17 years and six months.

We offer a broad range of courses that cater for different academic abilities. Most Year 11 students will choose one of four pathways and will make their subject selections from within that pathway.

Listed below is some information and guidelines to consider when making your pathway selection.

1. **AUSTRALIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS RANK (ATAR) Pathway: For students preparing for University entry post Year 12.**
  - These courses have an external exam at the end of Year 12, and students studying these courses will receive an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) that is recognised by all Australian Universities.
  - In order to gain direct entry to university and attain an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR), students must select at least four, Units 3 and 4 ATAR courses in Year 12.
2. **VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET) PATHWAY: For students intending to complete Nationally Recognised Training in Years 11 and 12.**
  - Students may complete Pre-Apprenticeship in Schools (PAiS) Certificates, VET in Schools (VETiS) Certificates or Trade Training Centre certificates in this pathway.
  - These courses are practical and involve nationally recognised training in the specific industry area. These are delivered by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) or State Training Provider (STP). These courses can lead to apprenticeships, employment, or further VET study post Year 12.
  - Students are generally in school three days each week for PAiS and VETiS certificates and 2 days at South West Institute of Technology and/or on workplace learning.
3. **GENERAL PATHWAY: For students preparing for further training or employment post Year 12.**
  - These are usually at Unit 1 and 2 General courses in Year 11 and Units 3 and 4 General courses in Year 12.
  - Students may complete Vocational Education and Training (VET) Certificate courses at Dalyellup College throughout the week in this pathway.
4. **VOCATIONAL PREPARATION PATHWAY (VPP): For students seeking an individualised pathway.**
  - Students who wish to undertake a Vocational Pathway and gives them access to Certificate courses at TAFE and Workplace Learning.
  - The VPP program gives students the opportunity to study in a flexible learning program which involves attending three days of school (Monday to Wednesday) and two days studying at a TAFE campus and/or Work Placement in their chosen field or course.
  - There may be factors that have impacted student attendance or engagement e.g. numeracy or literacy struggles.

## AUSTRALIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS RANK (ATAR) PATHWAY

*For students preparing for university entry post Year 12.*

These courses are aimed at students looking towards direct entry to a university. Students must select a minimum of four ATAR Courses to qualify for university entrance and receive an ATAR.

We recommend that students study 5 ATAR subjects on this pathway.

To be considered for university as a school leaver using ATAR, students must:

- Meet the requirements for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE)
- Meet English Language Competency standards as outlined by each university through one of: ATAR English, ATAR Literature, ATAR EAL/D or equivalent (scaled score of 50 or above), the minimum requirements in the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) written test for English.
- obtain a sufficiently high ATAR for entry to a particular course, and
- satisfy any prerequisites or special requirements for entry to a particular course

All Year 12 ATAR courses require a compulsory external examination at the end of Year 12. Students will need to consult with university guides and / or TISC to determine if the courses they are aiming for have any specific prerequisites.

### ATAR PATHWAY FAQ

- Students are aiming for university entrance
- ATAR Course Units 1&2 are studied in Year 11
- ATAR Course Units 3&4 are studied in Year 12
- Courses are content based
- External exams (WACE exams) are sat at the end of Year 12
- ATAR score based on 50% school assessment and 50% external exams
- Students gain an ATAR score based on their best 4 courses
- A minimum of 4 ATAR subjects are required but 5 or 6 are recommended
- Certificate courses are undertaken in Year 11 and/or Year 12

## VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET) PATHWAY

*For students intending to complete Nationally Recognised Training in Years 11 and 12.*

Vocational Education and Training (VET) enables students to gain a nationally recognised industry-specific qualification whilst completing their secondary school education. VET programs prepare students for the world of work and provide hands-on training. The completion of VET programs provides a broad range of post school options and pathways as well as contributes to the West Australian Certificate of Education (WACE).

By successfully completing a VET pathway program, students should be well placed to gain employment, apprenticeships, and traineeships or they can enrol in further study. At Dalyellup College, students can work toward a qualification across a variety of industry areas. Completing any of these certificate courses will provide a direct path to further training. There is a requirement for students undertaking some of these VET Certificate courses to engage in work placement (WPL).

Students selecting this pathway are preparing for apprenticeships in trade industries or for further training or employment post Year 11 or 12. Students attend Dalyellup College 3 days each week. On the two remaining days of the week, students will attend either the TAFE or a Trade Training Centre.

Students are able to select from the ATAR subjects and SIDE subjects. Students are also able to select endorsed programs.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING AN VET PATHWAY APPLICATION:

*There is a wide array of VET courses available for students to consider. consider the range of VET options available to students studying at Dalyellup College.*

1. Choose a **Pre- Apprenticeship in Schools (Pais) Certificate OR a certificate offered at a Trade Training Centre** by placing a (1) adjacent to the course you prefer then identify a second certificate to act as a “reserve” by placing a (2) next to it.
2. Students must complete an external VET application form
3. Students will then select 6 other courses in order of preference. These will be used to determine student interest in courses.
4. Students **must** choose an English course in Year 11. Place a 1 next to English
5. Students are recommended to choose a mathematics course in Year 11. Place a 2 next to Maths
6. Choose your 4 remaining selections from the subjects below.
7. Include two reserves and number them 7 and 8
8. Students selecting a certificate will automatically be placed in Workplace Learning.

**GENERAL PATHWAY**

*For students preparing for further training or employment post Year 12.*

A general pathway is for students seeking full-time attendance at Dalyellup College intending to undertake courses that meet their interests. They aim to build knowledge and skills across a broader array of Learning Areas.

This pathway is more suitable for students interested in pursuing a VET pathway after the completion of year 12 or for students seeking to enter the workforce following school.

For students undertaking this pathway, we recommended that they undertake the study of a certificate course although this is not a requirement. We have options available at the college and via SIDE. Students undertaking this pathway may also study ATAR courses that they are interested in. Students here will be encouraged to undertake Workplace learning as well.

Students need to consider the following programs and identify their preferred pathway based on their interests and abilities. These programs do not require students to sit external examinations at the end of Year 12 or have no prerequisites.

Although students will not undertake a formal external examination period, they will sit an Externally Set Task (EST) set by the Authority for assessment. The EST takes place in Semester 1 of Year 12 and contributes to 15% of the course marks.

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING AN VET PATHWAY APPLICATION:**

1. Students must select SIX subjects, as outlined in the Senior School Course Handbook.
2. Students must select an English course in Year 11. Select an English course by placing a 1 in the box adjacent to the course you prefer.
3. Students should consider a Mathematics course in Year 11. You can do this by placing a 2 in the box.
4. Choose your 4 remaining selections from the subjects below.
5. Include two reserves and number them 7 and 8

## VOCATIONAL PREPARATION PATHWAYS FOR YEAR 11 AND 12 STUDENTS (VPP)

*For students who are seeking an individualised pathway and who are Year 12.*

Dalyellup supports students who wish to take a more flexible program. The VPP program gives students the opportunity to study in a flexible learning program that involves attending three days of school (Monday to Wednesday) and two days in other options such as a certificate at TAFE, Work Placement, part-time employment, further studies, or training in their chosen field or course. Students selecting this pathway may have literacy and numeracy challenges or other factors impacting their engagement with school.

The program aims to develop students' work habits for TAFE and/or further study. Programs are tailored to individual needs and may involve activities in and outside the school. While the classes are of mixed ability, all students are encouraged to aim for high achievement and to become independent and confident learners. Regular communication with parents/caregivers and scaffolded learning encourages all students to engage and achieve their individual goals.

The VPP aims to develop students' skills, confidence and career planning while working towards Certificate completion, Traineeship, or apprenticeship. Other life skills courses are also integrated, such as Problem Solving and Decision Making, Financial Literacy and Study Skills. The VPP is designed for students who are considering making the transition into the workplace and/ or TAFE when they leave school.

The program includes the following:

- Literacy and numeracy within Foundation Courses / EALD English and Foundations / General Maths
- The Career and Enterprise course explores trends in the workforce and provides opportunities for students to establish and consolidate work readiness skills in the areas of: Job seeking, resume writing, application writing and addressing selection criteria, Interview experience and Employability skills
- An Endorsed Program – which will be selected based on student interest but will involve volunteer activities and an opportunity to be involved with the Capel community.
- A Leadership Certificate – with units of competency that will build specific employability skills.
- Individual Pathway Plans to help students develop a realistic understanding of the working world, explore career options and take part in activities to increase self-understanding, maturity, independence and confidence.
- Students can work part-time in paid work, study at TAFE, or the Trade Training Centre, and / or undertake a Traineeship or workplace learning.
