

Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges

The following information is provided to clarify the contributions and charges structure for parents. We wish to assure parents that our efforts have been directed towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible and in accordance with the Education Act Regulations.

The 2024 Charges and Voluntary Contributions statements for each year level provide details on how the voluntary contribution amounts are allocated to learning areas from Year 7 to Year 10, as well as the compulsory charge for elective courses. The Year 11 and 12 course is considered post compulsory as students can choose to attend TAFE, obtain employment or an apprenticeship, and therefore all charges are compulsory under the Education Act Regulations.

Information on maximum possible costs for other optional activities such as excursions and camps that students may choose to participate in has also been provided.

Contributions and Charges

Contributions and charges consist of three components:

1. Voluntary Contributions

The College is requesting a voluntary contribution of \$235 for each Year 7 to 10 student towards the cost of materials, resources, photocopying costs, text books and facilities used by students in their educational program. These contributions will make a significant contribution to the provision of educational resources used to deliver high quality educational programs.

2. Compulsory Charges

- (a) Year 9 and 10 elective courses may attract a compulsory charge. Year 11 and 12 course charges are considered compulsory under the Education Act Regulations. There is no maximum charge for these courses, however the school will keep costs to a minimum.
- (b) Extra Cost Optional Activities which address broad learning outcomes and for which there is an extra compulsory cost e.g. excursions, camps, carnivals, social events etc. Maximum possible costs for these is listed at the back of this handbook. Parents are required to pay only if students choose to participate in these activities. These charges will be requested throughout the year as the activities arise.

(c) External Courses – Year 11 and 12

- Charges relating to external courses delivered or auspiced by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) or external provider are payable directly to Dalyellup College.
- A 50% deposit of the compulsory course charges is required with the enrolment application, with the remaining balance due prior to commencement of the course in early February 2024.
 If payment is not received by the due date, the enrolment will be cancelled, and students withdrawn from the course.
- Depending on the chosen industry, students may also be required to purchase a uniform, protective equipment, textbooks and trade equipment/tools.
- Successful applicants will be advised of the costs associated with each program, together with letters of offer prior to the commencement of tuition.

3. Other Costs

- (a) Personal items which the students require to participate in an elective course such as safety glasses, stationery, calculators, etc., which can be purchased from any supplier.
- (b) General optional items which students may choose to use or purchase but are not considered essential to the educational program.

Voluntary Approved Requests

The following voluntary donations will appear on student Contributions and Charges statements:

- P & C Fundraising Donation \$20.00 per family. If you would like input into where fundraising monies are spent, please consider becoming a member and attend meetings held twice per term.
- School Chaplaincy Program \$20.00 per family. The role of the chaplain is to provide for the pastoral care needs of all students. School chaplains counsel students and can provide families with support on a range of issues or to advise them of other sources of support in the community. Whilst funded in part by the National School Chaplaincy Programme as a Christian presence within the school, it is not the role of the chaplain to teach or espouse religious beliefs to students. Rather, the chaplain plays an integral part of the Student Services Team within a school to help and support students who may be having difficulties with a wide range of issues such as bullying, anxiety, depression, friendship, and relationship issues.

Payment Options

Parents/carers will be issued with a 2024 Charges & Contributions statement in Term 4 2023 advising charges and voluntary contributions payable for each student for the coming year.

Payment may be made by any of the following methods:

- BPay: details listed on student statement.
- **Direct Deposit:** details listed on student statement
- In person by cheque, cash or EFTPOS.
- Telephone credit card payment by phoning 9797 9200
- Compasspay customised payment plan

Payment of compulsory charges is due by Wednesday 24 April 2024. Please contact the college administration on 9797 9200 if you wish to discuss payment options or set up a payment plan.

Refund Policy

The refund, or transfer to another school, of Charges and Voluntary Contributions will be completed in accordance with the Department's 'Refund of Charges and Voluntary Contributions in Secondary Schools' policy. All refund payments are made via EFT, and refunds less than \$10 will be credited to the student's account and used to offset other costs as directed by parents.

The School Board has endorsed a 'No Refund' policy for payments, including deposits for camps, excursions and other optional activities, where costs are not recoverable by the school. However, a refund may be approved under extenuating circumstances.

Financial Assistance

A broad range of scholarships are available to secondary students. Information regarding scholarships can be found on the Department of Education website: www.education.wa.edu.au/scholarships

Statements will be emailed to parents at the beginning of the school year. Reminder statements will be emailed at least four times per year. This will be followed up with phone calls where necessary.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to contact the Manager Corporate Services if they are experiencing difficulties paying charges and voluntary contributions by the due date. The Manager Corporate Services or Principal have the discretion to negotiate and recommend a payment arrangement that is suitable to both the family and the school. A payment arrangement, once established, will be expected to be adhered to.

Where parents/guardians fail to respond to communication from the school and/or will not agree to a payment arrangement, students may not be able to participate in high-cost elective courses.

Student Requirements

Campion Education have been selected as the preferred 2024 student requirements provider; however, items can be purchased from any supplier of your choice. The college has elected not to receive a commission from sales to keep costs to a minimum for parents.

Parents are not required to purchase textbooks for students in Years 7 to 10. Voluntary contributions enable the college to purchase class sets which students may borrow. If students lose textbooks or library books they will be expected to pay for the purchase of a replacement book.

Textbooks form part of the compulsory charges for Year 11 and 12 subjects. These books can be purchased from Campion Education or a supplier of your choice. Please see the relevant Student Requirements List available from the school website at http://www.dalyellupcollege.wa.edu.au/ for further details. Some subjects may not have textbooks listed. In this case the textbook or textbook hire fee may be included in the subject charge.

Safety Glasses

It is a safety requirement of the school that students must have a pair of approved safety glasses for all Design & Technology classes. All Year 7 and 8 students will participate in these classes throughout the year and will require safety glasses. Year 9 to 12 students will require glasses only if participating in these classes as an elective course. Please refer to the Student Requirements lists. For those who choose not to purchase their own, the school provides a class set for student use.

Calculators

All students require a scientific calculator to fully meet the requirements of the mathematics curriculum. Please refer to the relevant Student Requirements list for specifications.


SmartRider Cards

All Dalyellup College students are issued with a SmartRider Card free of charge when they first enrol. The ID card, similar to ones displayed, has several functions including:

- Signing in and out during school hours via the Kiosk located at Reception
- Borrowing books and resources from the Library
- The reverse side of the card is the SmartRider card which enables students to access concession travel on Transperth bus, rail and ferry services, and TRANSWA country road and rail services. Cards are issued with a zero balance. Value will need to be added to the card before it can be used for travel purposes.
- Cinemas will also accept the card as proof of student status
- Replacement ID cards are available from Student Services at a cost of \$5.00 each.

Please Note: The SmartRider card production is outsourced to an external company. This company will need to access information about your child from the school database, including name, address and date of birth.

Secondary Assistance Scheme

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

The Secondary Assistance Scheme consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian bank account. It can between take between 8 to 12 weeks to receive this payment.
- \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school. For students in Years 7 to 10 the allowance will be applied, in the first instance, towards the voluntary contribution. For students in Years 11 and 12 the allowance will be applied to cover charges in the first instance.

The parent/guardian concession card must be valid during first term. Students must be listed on claimant's card; except for some year 11 and 12 students, or in cases of disability/health reasons. In this instance, the school must sight both concession cards. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. Living Away from Home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Health Care Card
- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card
- Veteran's Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds a health care card in their name and is declared independent by the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application. The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Late Applications

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation. Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application. ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance is available to valid Department of Human Services (Centrelink) card holders, this funding supplements the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) ABSTUDY Fees Allowance payment. To be eligible for the supplement allowance, the parent/guardian must hold a Department of Human Services (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family. Furthermore, the school or parent must have received the School Fee Allowance of \$78 or \$156 from the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) as part of the student's ABSTUDY School Fees Allowance. The Department of Education ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance consists of \$79 paid directly to the school.

Please note that the Secondary Assistance Scheme cannot be claimed as well as this allowance.

Applications are completed by the parent or guardian for student(s) enrolled in Years 7 to 12, studying a full-time secondary course at a Western Australian public or private school. Applications submitted for students from interstate for the ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance must be made within one month of the student enrolling at the school.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Health Care Card
- Department of Human Services (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card
- Veteran's Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds a health care card in their name and is declared independent by the Department of Human Services (Centrelink) (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application. The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Late Applications

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation. Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.
